Laurence Lavigne Lalonde seeks to lead **Projet Montréal**

VSPE borough mayor hopes to replace Valérie Plante as mayor of Montreal

Villeray-Saint-Michel-Parc-Extension borough mayor Laurence Lavigne Lalonde has added her name to a growing list of candidates seeking to replace Valérie Plante as leader of Projet Montréal and as Montreal's mayor following municipal elections next fall.

Among other things, according to news coverage following her announcement, Lavigne Lalonde has pledged to prohibit Airbnb apartment rentals in order to get a handle on the housing crisis.

"We have to protect our rental stock," she told journalists during a press conference held at a Villeray bistro last week. She said that in the first 100 days of her administration, she would forbid Airbnb from operating in Montreal "until the housing crisis is resolved."

Airbnb rentals targeted

If elected mayor of the centre city, Lavigne Lalonde said her administration would pass a by-law selectively banning certain types of rental practices associated with tourism. "We have other ways of attracting tourists, for developing that particular option," she said.

She made it clear she would not be interested in getting the city involved in the promotion of major projects, "because I actually think they take an enormous amount of time and that people are a little tired." She suggested that efforts would be better spent trying to improve the efficiency of Montreal's public transit agency, the Société de transport de Montréal.

Borough mayor since 2021

First elected in 2013 as a city councillor for the east-end district of Maisonneuve, Laurence Lavigne Lalonde won the mayoralty of Villeray-Saint-Michel-Parc-Extension in 2021.

Before entering politics, she was a support worker in the domain of mental health, after which she was a manager for a number of non-governmental organizations involved in the promotion of international projects.

She does not conceal the fact she belongs to the more left-leaning faction in Projet Montréal. "Times are hard for progressives here and elsewhere" and "more could be done," she said.

She said that if elected, she would grant a tax holiday to non-profit groups involved in housing so as to allow them to stretch their budgets to the max.

Leans towards the east

Her pledge is in line with a measure taken recently by the current City of Montreal administration, which promised by next year to roll back \$10.5 million in "compensation in lieu of tax" paid by around 700 sports, cultural and community groups.

Lavigne Lalonde also suggested her administration would lean towards improving the development of the east-end of Montreal, saying the area had too often been neglected, and that housing and transportation could be improved there.

As of earlier this week, several leading lights in Projet Montréal had expressed their willingness to support Laurence Lavigne Lalonde's ambitions to lead the party and to become mayor of Montreal. Among them were Mercier-Hochelaga-Maisonneuve borough mayor Pierre Lessard-Blais, VSPE borough councillor Sylvain Ouellet, and Projet Montréal city councillors Virginie Journeau and Éric Alan Caldwell.

Other mayoralty candidates

Up to a half-dozen other Projet Montréal insiders have also recently come out saying they are interested in seeking the party's leadership position and the centre-city mayoralty in the municipal elections next fall.


They include former Projet Montréal president Guedwig Bernier, Plateau-Mont-Royal borough mayor Luc Rabouin, Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce borough mayor Gracia Kasoki Katahwa, and Lachine borough mayor Maja Vodanovic.

The beginning of the party's campaign period timeline won't begin until February 3. Campaigning is expected to take place over a period of around a month and a half, with voting by accredited Projet Montréal party members scheduled to take place on March 15.

Joy to the world in search of peace and goodwill to all

L's Christmas season. The spiritual and secular traditions are in full swing, as songs and greeting cards ring out heartwarming messages of Peace, Joy, Love, and Goodwill towards all. Sorry to say – very sad, indeed – but surely, I'm not alone thinking that these are pretty empty words this year.

What peace? What joy? Within families, one can hope. Within communities, definitely possible. But the world-at-large isn't promoting peace and joy. The Earth's most powerful leaders don't seem to care for these sentiments. Meanwhile, we wallow in our version of chaos. A world-order based on cooperation, compassion, and compromise seems to be unraveling. So, what can be done to restore credibility to messages of peace, love, joy, and goodwill-to-all? Start by nurturing ourselves? Concentrate on positives instead of despairing? Spread supportive thoughts and deeds in our community? Our world is broken - increasing numbers turn from God; suicides, immorality, depression, addiction levels rise exponentially, and attacks explode, especially the corrosive hostility towards Jesus Christ and Christmas.

Our world is shattered? Nothing new. 2700-years-ago the prophet Isaiah warned that humanity would turn this way: Going against the Word-of-God will bring darkness but inturning to God, there will be great hope and light.

Now, I wouldn't mind if non-believers opened The New Testament to read and think about the alternatives therein, honestly evaluated them and concluded "now I have made my careful decision, based on integrity." And then ask themselves truthfully - "Am I going against Christianity?" If this is their thinking, I would consider that a responsible decision – not a good decision but a responsible decision, with evidence weighed.

It's a very risky business. Isaiah of the Old

Testament, ignored and despised by most of his people, notched prediction-after-prediction. But I cringe at the most disappointing of all his optimistic prognostications - there will be a great peace – no more need for soldiers' uniforms.

Where is this peace? Battles everywhere! Wars, grievances, conflict, immeasurable human-gendered death-and-destruction. Christianity has had 2000 years to produce peace, so where is it? You-and-I will only be saved from darkness, disillusion, cynicism, skepticism and pessimism by listening to THE WISE ONE.

When we listen, Jesus Christ is not silent, not dumb, not dull. Again and again, the wisdom and beauty in the replies of the Son-of-God-Made-Man, completely confounded and continues to confound His critics while thrilling those who heeded and heed His invitation to Love God and Love Others.

The identity and truth of Jesus is crucial. Somebody who gets it all has come into our world. We would be crazy to turn our backs on Him, change subject and talk about anything else. No! we need His help urgently, now. The day of coming face- to-face with our Maker will come; our only hope is arriving forgiven. Let's ponder why do we do what we do, turning up at our family's feast (that's great), then leaving. It's easier today to miss Christmas since there are other things the season comes wrapped with. What a shame! But in deep humility, we gladly wish all Laval residents the very best gifts of all. Hope, goodwill and peace.

Hope in the Christmas Promise, fulfilled over centuries even when life seemed hopeless; hope living in local homes where families accept that events in our lives do occur for the best-of-reasons.

Hope that opens doors, shares goodwill, and celebrates, regardless of circumstances. That is as true today as it was during the wretched 1840s when Charles Dickens spoke these thoughts in 'A Christmas Carol': 'What place is this?' asked Scrooge. 'A place where miners live, who labor in the bowels of the earth,' returned the Spirit. 'But they know me. A light shone from the window of a hut ... Passing through the wall of mud and stone, they found a cheerful company assembled round a glowing fire.'

This symbolic moment-in-fiction, frozen in Christian timelessness, captures the meaning of goodwill and God Will. We are the cheerful company, gathered around the warmth-of-glowing-fire gifted by the Christ Child to humanity for all time.

And because we can agree on hope and goodwill, let's have peace with one another on Christmas Day 2024. It's not the dream of universal, permanent peace, but the type that each of us helps share because it was first shared with us. The effects of the Gift-of-Peace we can actually see, provided we don't let the wrappings get in the way. With these thoughts, on behalf of THE LAVAL NEWS, I wish you all a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. My desire is that by this time next year – somehow, some way – the seasonal wishes of Peace, Joy, Love, and Goodwill-to-All will not seem as hollow as they do at this moment. May our hope be restored.

Building stronger communities in VSL

A call for innovative projects to combat poverty and social exclusion

Montreal boroughs are encouraging local non-profit organizations to step forward with innovative projects that tackle poverty and social exclusion. This initiative aims to support meaningful actions that make a tangible difference in the lives of community members, especially those facing challenges related to food security, housing, and inequality.

Organizations planning projects that span three or more boroughs are also invited to apply under a separate program offering specialized resources and assistance. For all applicants, training sessions are available

to explain tools like ADS+ and the Social Development Subsidy Tracking Platform (SSDS). These sessions, while optional, provide valuable insights into navigating the application process.

Eligible projects include those that directly reduce poverty's impact or address its root causes. In Villeray–Saint-Michel–Parc-Extension, special priority is being given to initiatives focused on food security and affordable housing, with funding specifically allocated to support these critical areas.

The submission window is open from December 12, 2024, to February 7, 2025. During this period, organizations can also access guidance on brainstorming, refining, and writing their project proposals. Once the application phase ends, proposals will undergo a thorough evaluation, with selected projects moving forward for approval by the borough council in May 2025. Approved projects will launch on April 1, 2025, and run through March 31, 2029.

The total funding available for the four-year period is \$3,639,004, distributed annually across neighbourhoods based on their poverty levels. Villeray will receive \$291,120 per year, Saint-Michel \$345,706, and Parc-Extension \$272,925. This allocation ensures that resources are directed to the areas of greatest need, as determined by the Market Basket Measure (MBM) poverty index.

To assist organizations in creating strong proposals, community development advisors

and sports and recreation development agents are available for personalized consultations. These experts can offer valuable advice to ensure applications align with borough priorities and meet all requirements.

All proposals must be submitted via the SSDS platform by February 7, 2025, at noon. Applicants are encouraged to review the comprehensive reference materials to create detailed, impactful submissions.

This call for projects reflects the boroughs' commitment to fostering inclusive, supportive, and equitable communities. Non-profit organizations are encouraged to seize this opportunity to bring their ideas to life and contribute to a brighter, more equitable future for all.




Fun winter activities to make the most of your Christmas vacation



GST holiday offers relief to Park Extension residents

Starting this Saturday December 21st 2024, Park Extension residents as well as all Canadians will benefit from a temporary Goods and Services Tax (GST) holiday, part of a nationwide initiative to ease financial pressure on Canadians during the holiday season. The exemption, which runs until February 15, 2025, applies to a wide range of goods and services and aims to put more money back into the pockets of families and individuals. In a neighbourhood where affordability is often a top priority, this initiative is expected to provide meaningful relief.

The GST holiday covers many items that are essential during the festive season. Prepared foods such as meals, salads, and snacks, along with restaurant dining, are included. Families will find savings on children's clothing, shoes, car seats, and diapers—everyday necessities that can strain household budgets. Holiday items like Christmas trees, books, and toys also qualify for the exemption, allowing residents to stretch their holiday budgets a little further.



For Park Extension residents, this could mean significant savings. Spending \$2,000 on eligible items could save individuals between \$100 and \$260, depending on the province. This comes as a welcome boost for a community that prides itself on its hardworking families and small businesses.

While the tax break is designed to benefit consumers, it has also presented challenges for businesses. Local retailers have had to adapt quickly, reprogramming their systems and updating inventories to comply with the temporary rules. Some confusion or errors in applying the exemptions may occur, but mechanisms are in place for consumers to seek corrections and refunds if needed.

The GST holiday comes at a time when economic uncertainty remains a pressing issue. While the measure is expected to offer some relief, critics argue that it falls short of addressing the deeper economic challenges Canadians face. Some economists suggest that targeted solutions, such as enhancing existing GST credits for low-income families, might have provided more effective and long-lasting support. However, the government believes that this broad-based approach will stimulate spending and bring a sense of financial relief to communities like Park Extension during the holidays.

For Park Extension, a neighbourhood built on community and resilience, the GST holiday is an opportunity to navigate the season with fewer financial hurdles. Whether it helps families save on essentials or brings a little extra cheer to the holiday table, this initiative will surely be felt across the community, reinforcing the importance of thoughtful economic measures in times of need.

A cultural beacon in Parc-Extension: The maison de la culture de Parc-Extension

The heart of Parc-Extension has long been enriched by its vibrant arts and cultural scene, and now it shines brighter under a unified banner. Formerly known as La Salle de Diffusion, the venue has embraced a new identity as the Maison de la culture de Parc-Extension, aligning itself with the network of maisons de la culture across the city. Though the name has changed, the commitment to excellence in programming remains steadfast, offering an impressive array of free events and activities for all ages.

Located in the William-Hingston Complex, this 135-seat venue is a cornerstone of civic and cultural life in the neighborhood. Its accessible and inviting space hosts concerts, theater productions, conferences, film screenings, and art exhibitions, fostering creativity and community engagement. The transition to a Maison de la culture designation underscores the importance of simplified access to culture for all, uniting Parc-Extension with a broader citywide cultural vision.

Winter 2025 brings a compelling series of events to the Maison de la culture de Parc-Extension, showcasing diverse artistic expressions for all audiences. Théâtre Motus presents "Arbre," a family-friendly theatrical performance scheduled for February 2 at 11 a.m. The innovative ensemble Cordâme will perform "Fabula Femina," blending classical and modern influences, on February 8 at 4 p.m. A captivating winter-themed production, "Flocon," by Jessica Blanchet, follows on February 16 at 11 a.m. On March 6 at 1:30 p.m., Les MiniMalices will perform "Au bout du conte," an engaging exploration of storytelling. The season concludes with "Mélodie Merle, l'oiseau rare," a musical collaboration involving Yanick Villedieu, Marika Lhoumeau, and Brigitte Saint-Aubin, on March 16 at 11 a.m.

The Maison de la culture de Parc-Extension ensures that accessibility is at the forefront of its mission. The venue is fully wheelchair accessible, with a ramp located on Saint-Roch Street and facilities designed to accommodate all visitors. A visual access guide is available, and the dedicated team provides additional assistance to individuals with mobility challenges during events, ensuring everyone feels welcome and included.

In addition to its performances, the Maison offers free guided tours of its exhibitions and creative workshops by reservation. These are open to schools, community organizations, daycares, and other groups, reinforcing the venue's role as a hub for education and artistic exploration. The Maison also supports local creative professionals by providing artist residencies, offering them time and space to refine their work while engaging with the community in meaningful ways.

Sustainability is a central value for the Maison, as reflected in its Gold-level certification from the Conseil québécois des événements écoresponsables. 



